2025 Midyear Report

In the first half of 2025, 1,952 parents have participated in 172 PEPS Groups.

The impact of our work is clear: 99% of participant respondents reported finding others who understand what they're going through.

Beyond PEPS Groups, we supported parents through 12 workshops and events.

These gatherings included topics specific to parents of adolescents, grandparents, working moms, and LGBTQIA+ parents. We covered topics including adolescent stress, financial planning, and social connection.
